PRESIDENT'S UPDATES

a) District Updates: President Pam Luster stated she received a list of all the colleges that had sent in a Letter of Intent for the Baccalaureate degree pilot program. There were approximately 30 colleges with two other colleges submitting in the same area asth Mesa College (Health Information Management.) Pam stated that we will be submitting our proposal after the RFP is approved by the Board of Governors and released by the Chancellors Office. President Luster also shared that a Breakfast with the President was held yesterday with a mix of classified staff and faculty in attendance.

b) President's Cabinet / PIEC Joint Retreat, Dec. 2, 2014, 2-5 p.m., CE at Mesa room 118-120: President Luster reminded the members of PCab that the joint retreat with President's Cabinet and PIE Committee is in two weeks on Tuesday, December 2, 2014. This retreat will focus on assessing our planning systems, participatory governance structure and accreditation work.

COLLEGE-WIDE PLANNING

a) Accreditation Update: Dean and Accreditation Co-Chair Danene Brown stated that the Brown Bag event has been rescheduled to the Spring 2015 semester. Danene added that the District will administer an accreditation survey to employees and students. Many of the questions will remain the same as previous accreditation surveys, however due to the change in the accreditation standards new questions are being created. These new questions will be reviewed by the college's accreditation tri-chairs, PIEC and PCab. The survey will be administered in Spring 2015.

INSTRUCTION | VPI, Tim McGrath

a) Fall FTES: VPI Tim McGrath shared that the Fall FTES is down - currently at 100-150, but that we are on target to meet our annual FTES target.

b) Summer Schedule: VPI McGrath stated that he and President Luster are monitoring the enrollment for Spring 2015. The initial Summer schedule will be completed in December and adjustments will be made if necessary in February 2015 to add additional classes, including some evening classes. At Wednesday's

Dean meeting Tim stated he will ask the Deans to begin this discussion with their Chairs and departments on expanding the summer class schedule.

STUDENT SERVICES | VPSS, Julie Barnes

a) Student Success & Equity Updates: Dean Ashanti Hands shared that the partnership discussions with CUE and the Minority Male Community Collaborative are ongoing. The college along with CUE (Center for Urban Education) will hold a planning retreat on December 3, Noon – 5 p.m. which will focus on the vision and planning work. CUE is reviewing our documents to help provide structure and Mesa College is reviewing data from HSI and Student Success to be sure they align as well as establish inquiry teams on how to begin the process – matriculation is a possible area being considered.

A letter to faculty of the classes selected for students to be survey was sent in early November 2014. This is a partnership with SDSU's Minority Male Community College Collaborative (M2C3) to support ongoing institutional equity and planning efforts. Data will be collected from all students in the selective classes. In addition to the survey, M2C3 will conduct focus groups with Mesa faculty and students during the Spring 2015 semester.

Student Success: Dean Susan Topham shared that registration started this week and that 100+ students were in line to see counselors for spring registration and to develop their education plans through the Flash Forward to Your Future program where students will receive their Ed Plans on a flash drive bracelet. Also, Susan mentioned that on a State level, she will be getting information at a meeting on Thursday on the statewide Common Assessment Initiative. The Common Assessment Initiative will develop a Common Assessment System for the benefit of all California Community Colleges and their students. The Common Assessment System will contain test preparation, test delivery, test administration, data collection, and course placement guidance, and will use centralized and integrated technology solutions to support assessment and placement. Susan is looking for feedback and input from both math and English faculty regarding this initiative.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES | VPA, Rachelle Agatha

a) Web Update: VPA Rachelle Agatha stated that David Fierro, Lina Heil and herself are leading the Mesa College web advisory group (WAG) who have been meeting to develop a "site mapping" strategy for the Mesa College website. The next phase is to bring their proposal to Executive Staff and then the web advisory group will prepare to begin the first phase of the website rollout during the Spring 2015 semester.
