a) Commencement Ceremony: Dean of Student Affairs, Ashanti Hands, presented along with Monica Romero on the Celebration of our Students' Success – Commencement at San Diego Mesa College. This presentation described the ceremony and encouraged more attendance by students as well as their faculty to Commencement. b) Program Review Annual Report and Summary Report; Multi-year Calendar: Acting Dean of Institutional Effectiveness, Madeleine Hinkes, stated that the IE department is reviewing 95 program reviews that were submitted and preparing for committee reports; they should have a rough draft this Friday. In April, they expect to have a summary report to present at President's Cabinet including the collection of executive

summaries linking program review to all other aspects of planning and goals. In addition, the PIE Committee is working on a multi-year calendar of the accreditation seven-year cycle which will be brought forward to President's Cabinet. A discussion was held on how often a comprehensive program review would be held and it was suggested at PIEC for this process to be a four-year comprehensive program review held twice during the seven-year cycle.
