

## **DISTINCTIONS**

- Mesa College ranks among San Diego's top transfer institutions. Over the past five years, Mesa's transfer rate has consistently exceeded the statewide average by 5.1 percentage points. Nearly half of first-time students in the most recent five-year cohort transferred to a four-year postsecondary institution within six years (Source: CCCCO DataMart).
- Mesa College was the first community college in California to offer a bachelor's degree program in Health Information Management (HIM).
   Mesa made history by awarding the first set of bachelor's degrees in Spring 2018. Since 2018, 178 students have graduated from the Program.
- Mesa College is a designated Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI), an Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution (AANAPISI) a Silver Status Military Friendly College and multiple times as a Fulbright Top Producing Institution.
- Mesa College is a recipient of the national Family U Seal for the 2023–2026 period. The Family U Seal is a national certification granted by Generation Hope to higher education institutions that demonstrate exemplary, measurable efforts in supporting parenting students.
- Mesa College has earned national recognition as one of the top two-year college athletic programs. Presented by the National Alliance of Two-Year College Athletic Administrators (NATYCAA), the Ron Case Cup honors excellence in championship competition.
- Mesa College has been recognized in the 2025 Carnegie Classifications as a 'Mixed Associate Large' institution, an honor held by only 2% of U.S. colleges and universities. Mesa also earned a 'Higher Access, Medium Earnings' designation, affirming our commitment to equity and access while highlighting opportunities to strengthen post-college outcomes.
- Mesa College ranks #3 statewide in a recent ROI analysis conducted by the College Futures Foundation and the HEA Group. The study evaluated 327 colleges and 1.2 million learners, measuring how quickly students recoup educational costs through a Price-to-Earnings Premium (PEP) metric.

#### **ABOUT THE SDCCD**

As one of the largest of California's 73 community college districts, the San Diego Community College District serves approximately 100,000 students annually through three two-year colleges and the San Diego College of Continuing Education. San Diego City College, San Diego Mesa College, and San Diego Miramar College, offer associate degrees and certificates in occupational programs that prepare students for transfer to four-year colleges and entry-level jobs. Mesa College also offers a bachelor's degree in Health Information Management. The San Diego College of Continuing Education offers noncredit adult education at seven campuses throughout San Diego.
