3) INSTRUCTION (Tim McGrath, VPI)

a) Enrollment Update

Mesa is offering 1 less section this year compared to spring 2013. (86 more Census classes) Mesa is down 229 FTES from last year. (165 FTES in census classes) Spring 2013 = 7,155 Spring 2014 = 6,926

Headcount is down 111 students from last year which is statistically flat from last year.

24,766 = spring 2012 24,166 = spring 2013 24,055 = spring 2014

Note: City headcount = up 142 = 1% increase Miramar headcount = down 231 = 2% drop

Fill Rates (Both on-campus and online) are a combined 87% which is 4% lower than last year's rate of 91% at this time and 6% drop from 93% two years ago.

Enrollment Capacity (total seats – on campus and online)

63,434/69,338 = spring 2011 = 91% 62,070/66,213 = spring 2012 = 93.7% 61,658/66,780 = spring 2013 = 92.3% 59,562/67,710 = spring 2014 = 87% (equates to a drop of -1,700)

Load Factor

546 = spring 2011 566 = spring 2012 568 = spring 2013 530 = spring 2014

*Based on 557 load factor for 16.5 semester 525 = 17.5 semester

The group had a short discussion related to why we are a slight bit under our last spring enrollment. There are several factors that are attributed, including the razing of part of H-wing this semester, and the need to limit new sections. We are right on target to meet our annual FTES goal. Additionally, the college is gearing up with the rest of the district to offer a robust summer school.

4) STUDENT SERVICES (Julianna Barnes, VPSS)

a) Accreditation: Vice President Barnes shared on-screen the Mesa College draft document of the self-evaluation timeline for 2013-2016. The self-evaluation process will begin this spring as the accreditation committee reviews the operational structure. The first draft Julie presented today will be presented to the Accreditation subcommittee this week and then out for distribution to the college. b) Classified Senate (Angela Liewen): CS President Angela Liewen recognized Monica Romero for her service in finding classified staff to serve on committees. The Classified Senate will have two scholarships this year and Angela is working with Kathy Wells on the

Classified Awards event and will be the Mesa coordinator next year when Kathy retires this summer. Classified Senate will meet this Friday.
