1) PRESIDENT'S UPDATE:

- a) Welcome (Barnes): VP Julie Barnes chaired the President's Cabinet meeting for President Luster who attended a CEO Accreditation meeting. Tim McGrath welcomed San Diego MET High School principal Sara Leonard.
- b) Consent Agenda Approval: Sent via email for review:
 - Women's History Month, Varied dates, times/locations Motion: Angela Liewen; Second: Inna Kanevsky, after discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.
- c) District Updates (McGrath): VP McGrath shared that the District Enrollment report revealed that Mesa College is up over 200 in FTES. He also mentioned there was a discussion on a district-wide recognition of Program Advisory Committees (career tech.) The proposed date is June 5; location to hold 250 people on one of the college campuses has not been determined.
- d) Culture Climate Survey (Barnes): VP Barnes commented that President Luster sent out a link yesterday to the Cultural Climate survey and encouraged all to participate.

2) COLLEGE-WIDE PLANNING

- a) Staff and Professional Development Task Force Update (MacNeill): Dean Andy MacNeill stated he had received feedback on the proposed task force from Associated Students who will provide a student representative. Classified Senate will also provide a representative. Andy also shared that the current Staff Development Committee will be separate from this task force but that the members are welcome to serve on the task force. Andy stated the goal for this semester was to hold a couple of meetings and then a summer retreat. A motion was made to move forward in forming this task force by Monica Romero; Second: Ashanti Hands; the motion was approved unanimously. Andy will bring back a list of membership and proposed duration of task force to a future President's Cabinet meeting.

The process time will be very quick the RFP is expected in April with the grant deadline set for May. This year the competition is very tight with only 20 grants nationwide to be funded.
