PRESIDENT'S UPDATES

a) District Updates:

President Pam Luster stated that at this morning's meeting at Chancellor's Cabinet the report to add a Women's Sand Volleyball team was accepted. This is a new co-curricular sport that will be added at Mesa College for Spring 2015. The team will play at South Mission Beach until facilities are available at the campus. Pam also shared that, as of last week, the State Chancellor's Office released a proposed timeline for implementation of the pilot Baccalaureate programs. President Luster stated she met with the Health Information Technology Advisory Committee and they are very excited about receiving bachelor's level students for the Health Information Management degree. At this time in the process we are waiting on the pilot program information and we are completing the application for "Intent to Apply."

COLLEGE-WIDE PLANNING

a) Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILO) Graduate Survey (Bri Hays):

Bri Hays, campus-based researcher, gave a presentation on the 2014 Institutional Learning Outcomes Graduation Survey Results. Bri stated that this data informs the college through indirect assessment the level that students self-reported proficiency of the college's ILO's. The survey reflects the 2013

Chris Sullivan, faculty member and accreditation co-chair, presented the Spring 2010 – Spring 2014 Basic Skills Cohort Report. He mentioned that the most notable challenge is the momentum rate which is now lower than previous years for both ESOL and Math. A discussion followed which focused on identifying the factors that lead to why students have difficulty succeeding through basic skills ESOL and Math courses, including finding better ways to assess the momentum rate. Additionally, Mesa College is embarking on Title V HSI/Student Equity efforts that have resources for faculty to assess the pedagogy.
