The Mesa College Drama Department in collaboration with The San Diego Asian American Repertory Theatre Company Presents

Awareness of Self Through Other: a playwriting workshop exploring culture and identity Spring 2013 Three years ago the Mesa College Drama Department initiated a short-term residency program inviting local, professional "homeless" non-profit theatre companies to collaborate with students at Mesa College, in particular theatre majors in the Mesa College Theatre Company (MCTC). In 2010 the department collaborated with the San Diego Asian American Repertory Theatre Company producing a collection of new plays; in 2011 the company collaborated with the Common Ground Theatre company presenting a series of readings of plays by, about, or reflecting the African American Experience; and last year the company worked with InnerMission Productions on the play "No Child" by Nilaja Sun. Every presentation included post-performance talkbacks with hosted by visiting professionals and educators in the field. This year we plan to work with the San Diego Asian American Repertory Theatre once again by hosting a playwriting workshop.

I. Purpose of Collaboration

- 1. Provide students with the opportunity to enhance their theatre training by working side by side with theatre professionals.
- 2. Grant theatre majors and Mesa students an opportunity to generate important professional relationships, links, and liaisons with professionals outside Mesa College.
- 3. Offer a successful local theatre company a space to continue the vital work of reaching out to our community through art.
- 4. Collaborating offers both agents the opportunity to continue to grow our audience and reach out to our community.
- 5. Foster important inter-campus and inter-disciplinary engagement and raise the profile of Mesa College as an important contributor to contemporary theatre practices.

II. Who is The San Diego Asian American Repertory Theatre Company

In May 2010, SDAART and Mesa initiated a successful collaboration with the *InnerViews: 10 minute Play Festival* — a production of new plays submitted by playwrights from across the country. SDAART most recently produced *Flower Drum Song* and *BFE* at La Jolla Playhouse when it was selected as Theatre-In-Residence. SDAART also won the PON award for excellence in promoting diversity from the National Association of Ethnic Studies.

SDAART Mission Statement: to produce plays that celebrate the Asian American experience in the context of a multicultural community. It presents perspectives on traditional works and supports new young artists.

SDAART Values and Vision: By preserving traditions that emphasize education, balanced family values, and the respect of history and senior generations, SDAART strives to foster community, peace, and awareness among different cultures and generations, while introducing new artistic voices that help to incorporate changes of the present with learnings from the past.

Our Goals: SDAART hopes to give flesh and voice to under-recognized Asian American plays and stage works by new and established artists to help bridge cross-generational and cross-cultural gaps and transcend stereotypes. Our work pushes participants to rethink their image and pre-judgments of Asian Americans, increasing knowledge and awareness of the diverse experiences in the United States. SDAART strives to develop an Endowment which would help make the dramatic process and production a continuing reality, thus enhancing the San Diego arts community and literary landscape in general

ELISE KIM PROSSER, Ph.D. (President) performed in SDAART's productions of Joy Luck Club (2008) and The House of Chaos (2007). Her performances received favorable critics' reviews in San Diego Union-Tribune, the Reader, San Diego City Beat, and Asia, the Journal of Culture & Commerce. She has also written a play about Korean-Americans. Off-stage, Dr. Prosser is a marketing professor, researcher, consultant, and author on branding, forecasting, and management. She has consulted with major motion picture studios about entertainment marketing. She also served as a Grand Juror at the San Diego Asian Film Festival and has recruited films at Sundance Film Festival (2009). Her education includes a Ph.D from USC, MBA from NYU, and BS in economics from Wharton at Univ. of Penn. prosserelise@yahoo.com

PETER JAMES CIRINO (Vice President) Associate Professor SDSU and founder of innumerable Theatre companies internationally. "My greatest gift as an artist is my crosscultural experience, both in my personal life and my professional one. I spent my formative years in Dallas, Texas, in a small area in the heart of downtown known as Little Mexico Village. Not only did Latinos (such as myself) live in this small geographical location but also Native Americans, Blacks, Filipinos, and Asians. In spite of all the turmoil and depredation that accompany an inner city existence, we came together as a community. We accepted and embraced each other's differences and began a life long journey exploring the beauty within each culture we encountered. Although many died, a few did make it out, and this is the basis for my involvement in the Diversity movement. In all I do, I strive to represent the best of all worlds, the ideas of many to express one movement, action or text. I have translated Spanish classical literature, modern South American texts and adapted German, French and Greek plays. As I nurture artists of my same ilk, I continue to create theatre with the same ideas of diversity that I used to develop the personal world around me: theatre that casts blindly, theatre that visits many cultures in one text, that explores texts in different languages, uses artists of varied disciplines to create new ones, and theatre that always fosters new mixtures of growth as artists and people of color." cirpopino@sbcglobal.net

All Tech rehearsals and performances will be supervised by Mesa College faculty. With the exception of technical rehearsals, rehearsals for all included productions will be held off-site.

Marketing and Press Relations

SDAART will provide artwork for the posters and handbills. Mesa Drama has agreed to provide printing and mailing costs up to 500.00. The cost of any mailings done by SDAART will be absorbed by SDAART. SDAART will be responsible for posting the performances in the Reader and the UT as well as on the San Diego Theatre Scene. SDAART will also work towards a feature article in the UT entertainment section and the Reader.
