The 2019 Commencement Ceremony was a huge success, and we sent our graduates off with encouragement to approach the world and say, "This is Me!" Mesa's 55th graduating class altogether received 1,789 academic degrees and 411 certificates. For the second time, Mesa awarded a Bachelor of Science degree in Health Information Management (HIM), as well as the second set of San Diego Promise graduates—whose education was funded under the San Diego Community College District's free-tuition program. The Class of 2019 had 22 valedictorians, nearly 500 students who graduated with honors, and over 200 students who earned more than one degree. Amongst Mesa's diverse graduates was the youngest, age 17, and the eldest, age 71.
