# That's Resilience

**Board of Trustees Meeting Comes to Mesa** Mesa College will host the District's Board of Trustees meeting on Thursday, November 14, 2019, in Mesa Commons 211 A/B. Faculty, staff, and students will present to the Trustees and Chancellor at 4:00 p.m., highlighting successes and ongoing projects at the College. This year's theme is "That's Resilience," and will focus on Mesa's Equity efforts, with special presentations by Mesa students. The presentation will be followed by the regular business meeting of the Board of Trustees at 5:00 p.m. All are welcome, and light refreshments will be served.

# **Taste of Mesa**

On October 24, we celebrated our annual <u>Taste</u> of <u>Mesa</u> event. Over 130 guests tasted samples of various culinary delights prepared by Mesa College Culinary Arts students and alumni in the cook-off competitions. Bidding was intense for the Silent Auction, and prizes included cooking lessons with local award-winning chefs. Our generous sponsors included The French Gourmet, San Diego Hilton Bayfront, Knife Merchant, San Diego Seafood, and Chef Works, who each donated food, gifts, or prizes valued at over \$500. Proceeds from *Taste of Mesa* will be used to purchase ingredients that will help train students for the farm-to-table style restaurants that are becoming more common in today's market.





#### **Mobile Market Debut**

The Stand opened the <u>Mobile Market</u> for the first time on October 7. Much like the Farmer's Market, the Mobile Market will offer students and members of the Mesa College community access to free produce. The Mobile Market will be held on the first Monday of the month, near the LRC.

#### LGBTQ+ Celebration Week

Mesa College held <u>LGBTQ+ Celebration Week</u> on October 14 through 18. Events around campus that supported and highlighted our LGBTQ+ community included a panel of advocates who discussed issues about gender identity; a discussion addressing how sex-ed can be more inclusive; and many artistic forms of queer expression, showcased by Honors students. The week culminated in a Drag Queen Q & A, with the Spectrum Masquerade Ball on October 18.

#### **Undocumented Students Week**

Mesa held several events during Undocumented Student Week, between October 14 - 18. The events around campus supported our undocumented students and their allies with workshops and a student panel. <u>The Dreamer Resource Fair</u> allowed our students to explore the various resources available to them, and the Open House gave family and friends the opportunity to learn about the Borderless Scholars programs. Various universities came to inform students about their Dreamer Student Services. Undocumented Students Week ended with a film screening of "DOCUMENTED," followed by a Q&A session.

#### Hunger and Homelessness Week

Between November 18 and 22, to further our equity efforts, Student Services will host several events as a part of Hunger & Homelessness Week. Students are able to both give and receive by taking part in multiple events including resource workshops, the Farmer's Market, and the annual AS Thanksgiving Feast. The annual AS Thanksgiving Feast will be held on November 21. This event was created to assist students who are unable to go home for the holidays, and will provide food, games, an opportunity drawing, and entertainment. The event will be held in Mesa Commons 211 A/ B, from 2:00 - 5:00 p.m.

#### Mesa Pathways Update

October was a busy month for Mesa Pathways. Mesa had strong representation at the Strengthening Student Success Conference with 27 people attending the three-day event. The conference offered several strands focused on Pathways, equity, and other initiatives. "Looking at Language in the Classroom," an excellent FLEX workshop led by Inna Kanevski, examined the language we use with students. Mesa Mixers continued this month providing more opportunities for discussions around program mapping and cross discipline opportunities. There are two more opportunities slated for November 1 and November 13, both in BT 215 from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. Leading From the Middle had its final convening, and the team will be presenting its project which centers around communication, at the December 10 PCAB meeting. We will also be completing the final review of the Guided Pathways Self-Assessment at this meeting. On November 15 we will have the final FLEX event for this semester. ASCCC members Janet Fulks, Jessica Alabi, and Ty Simpson will be presenting "Governance Processes that Sustain and Enhance the Mesa Pathways Work." This workshop will run from 9:00 am - 2:00 pm. This event is for the entire campus and all are encouraged to come and participate. Finally, on November 22, the ASCCC Guided Pathways Task Force will hold the Fall 2019 Regional Guided Pathways meeting at Imperial Valley College.


#### Master Planning Update

On October 22<sup>nd</sup> 2019, the Planning and Institutional Effectiveness (PIE) Committee held an extended meeting to do integrated planning assessment with the members of the President's Cabinet, Budget Allocation









Recommendation Committee, and Master Plan Task Force.

At this extended PIE Committee meeting, the faculty, staff and administration that attended worked together to come up with the following recommendations for Mesa College's Education Master Plan:

- Connect students to all elements in planning
- Show relationships between/among plans
- Create standard definitions of terms with timelines
- Align definitions with accreditation standards
- Embed evidence throughout

These findings were presented at the President's Cabinet Retreat on October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2019. During this PCAB retreat, it was agreed upon that moving forward, the Master Planning Task Force would be focused on expanding their membership to add more representation from around the college including:

- VPs of Instruction and Student Services
- Representation from each Instructional School
- Representation from each Student Services Division
- Representation from College Technology

The Master Planning Task Force will be spending the next few weeks working with the Mesa community to add constituents from the above groups.
