As many of you know, we launched our Resiliency Fund Campaign at Convocation, and many of you made contributions for which I would like to thank you. In just under 6 weeks, we have already raised over \$50,000 (includes match). This is truly amazing for our students! The Resiliency Fund will provide one-time emergency loans and grants to students experiencing financial setbacks that put them at risk of dropping out. Our goal is to raise \$250,000 towards the Resiliency Fund to help at least 1,000 students overcome financial setbacks and stay in school. Our entire campus and broader community are invited to invest, and donors have the chance to double their impact through November. Please join us as we preserve the dream of a college education.

Master Planning Update

This semester, Mesa College will be kicking off the Educational and Facilities Master Planning Process. As you may recall, in the last academic year the Planning and Institutional Effectiveness Committee (PIE), with approval from President's Cabinet (PCab), created the Master Planning Task Force. Tasks of the task force that were accomplished over the summer, and in the beginning part of this fall semester, included: the review and selection of a planning consulting firm to assist the college with facilitation of the planning process. We are pleased to announce that after an extensive review and interview process, the task force membership selected Gensler, an integrated architecture, design, planning, and consulting firm.









Additionally, we have applied for an Institutional Effective Partnership Initiative (IEPI) grant to further assist with ensuring that Mesa Pathways and equity are integrated into the planning process. Next steps include collaborative meetings between the Gensler project leads, PIE, and President's Cabinet. We will be announcing ways for faculty and staff to participate as opportunities arise. More to come, stay tuned.

Mesa Pathways update

Mesa Pathways Committee and all four work groups are in full swing this fall. The work groups include Guided Majors and Mapping, Proactive and Integrated Student and Academic Support, Brave Communications, and Onboarding and Career Exploration. Guided Majors and Mapping have hosted two "Mesa Mixer" events, intended to bring instructional and non-instructional faculty together for cross-disciplinary discussions, and to continue the program mapping work. Brave Communications work group will be hosting a FLEX Event on Friday, October 18, on the topic of using "Plain Language" when communicating our work. Additional FLEX activities are planned for November and December. Work continues toward improving the Mesa Pathways webpage. A special thanks to Katie Palacios for helping develop a Mesa Pathways Canvas shell. We have begun the process of reviewing and updating the Mesa's Guided Pathways Essential Practices: Scale of Adoption Self-Assessment, and plan to have this approved through governance by the end of the semester. We are excited to continue our work on Mesa Pathways, and look forward to working with many of you this semester.

LGBTQ Celebration Week

Mesa College will celebrate LGBTQ+ Celebration Week from October 14 through 18. Everyone is invited to join our events around campus that will support and highlight our LGBTQ+ community. Events include a panel of advocates who will discuss issues about gender identity; a discussion on how sex-ed can be more inclusive; and Honors students will showcase many artistic forms of queer expression. A Drag Queen Q & A will culminate in a Masquerade Ball on Friday evening.
