Guided Pathways Update

Professors Toni Parsons, Mathematics and Natural Sciences, and Howard Eskew, Business and Technology, were selected as our first ever Mesa Faculty Pathways Co-coordinators. In conjunction with the Mesa Pathways Committee, the coordinators will oversee implementation of the Mesa Pathways work plan, develop yearly work plans, and make recommendations. Toni and Howard will coordinate and provide leadership for Guided Pathways work, Mesa Pathways Committee and Quad Chairs, serve as liaisons for inquiry teams/ bubbles, identify and arrange for professional learning opportunities to support MPC efforts. Additionally, they will oversee budget and financial requests, provide Pathways reports, serve as committee liaisons at campus, district and community meetings and events and assess outcomes. Professors Parsons and Eskew will report







to our new Vice President of Instruction and will assume responsibility in Spring 2019. All faculty, staff, and students are invited to learn more and get involved with our Mesa Pathways efforts.

2018 #GivingTuesday

This year Mesa participated in #GivingTuesday by accepting donations to The Stand. Thanks in part to many of you, the Stand received nearly \$1,000 in monetary support, plus three bins full of food and clothing. \$1,000 in donations allows Mesa College to stock The Stand for 1-2 weeks, depending on student need and use. Board of Trustees Meeting at Mesa

On Thursday, November 8, Mesa College hosted the San Diego Community College District Board of Trustees Meeting in MC 211. The theme for this year's meeting was "Students' Needs - Mesa's Promise." In keeping with our equity and pathways efforts, various faculty, staff, and students provided updates on several Mesa projects and events, including Mesa Journeys, Open Educational Resources (OER), and the Farmer's Market. As a highlight, multiple Mesa College students also provided testimonies about their involvement with key services and programs such as The Stand and STEM Conexiones. Additionally, Mesa provided a presentation of videos from former student athletes who have successfully transferred from Mesa to other colleges and universities. Everyone in attendance, including Board members, also had the opportunity to earn a social media badge from the LOFT.

November 2018 Presidents Cabinet Retreat

On November 14, 2018, we held a President's Cabinet Retreat with nearly 100 administrators, faculty, staff and students in attendance. Mesa Pathways Committee members presented a re-introduction and commitment to our Pathways' "Why", framework, and vision. Bubble Leads provided updates on current efforts that have been completed to date. They also discussed goals for Summer 2019 and how their plans have evolved. We then hosted a group activity in which retreat participants selected









a Bubble of interest and shared information about what excites them most about our work. Everyone was asked to brainstorm on additional information needed and how we can best communicate with the campus and engage students In Mesa Pathways. In addition, the Retreat focused on Planning and Pathways, and after a brief overview of the planning process at Mesa, we discussed the need to update the Educational Master Plan. This will be an opportunity to map our values and goals across our programs and initiatives, while also reviewing facility needs. A soon-to-be-assembled task force will guide the development, review, and collegewide vetting of the Plan.

AS Thanksgiving Feast

San Diego Mesa College's Associated Students (AS) hosted their 5th annual <u>Thanksgiving Feast</u> on November 15 at the Mesa Commons. Each year, AS partners with Mesa's Culinary Arts students to prepare a Thanksgiving meal for students to enjoy together, in the true spirit of Thanksgiving.
