## It's Smile Season at Mesa College!

Mesa hosted another successful **Women's History Month**. Our signature event was the [7<sup>th</sup> Annual Gracia Molina De Pick Lecture Series](#) which featured noted author and historian **Maria Garcia**, who spoke to over 60 attendees about her book *"La Neighbor: A Settlement House in Logan Heights"* and the role of Chicanas in San Diego Communities. Thanks to the faculty, staff, and students who made all the events possible.

The rain did not stop us from hosting a successful **Jumpstart** on Saturday, March 10. Over 300 prospective students joined us for tours, presentations, interactive demonstrations, workshops, and dancing—and they really got to experience Mesa. This year, the event also featured **Cash in on Community College** and Mesa was a host location for the **Festival of Science and Engineering's Festival Week**. Feedback was overwhelmingly positive, and I want to thank facilities for making the quick changes, and all departments who participated.

## Mesa College Culinary to Table Series

Mesa's new Culinary to Table Series is enjoying great success this semester. In February, Chef Davin White discussed fabrication, preparation, and sustainability with fish and shellfish; in March, there was a demon-





stration on poultry from Chef Michael Ground. Sessions have been filled with students and faculty, eager to learn about food preparation. Upcoming events will be on April 13 at 11:00 a.m., with an emphasis on goat cheese, and a May 4 at 11:00 a.m. demonstration on plant based foods. The sessions are \$25 at the door, and students are offered discounted tickets at \$10 each.

### STEM Community Scholars Embark on Tours

San Diego Mesa College is the proud recipient of a generous grant from The San Diego Foundation. The program, offered in conjunction with [STEM Conexiones](#), is known as STEM Community Scholars, and funds stipends and field trips for 13 students, as well as field trips for an additional 35 students. Mesa's STEM Community Scholars participated in their first field trip on March 2, which included a tour of Wild Willow Farm, a sustainable farm with educational resources, and a visit to the Tijuana River Estuary, in Imperial Beach. The next field trip will be this week to Mt. Laguna in the Cleveland National Forest.

### Speech & Debate Team Takes Over Montreal

In March, Mesa's Speech & Debate team went to Montreal to compete. The tournament was open to community colleges and 4-year universities, and Mesa College placed 3rd at the tournament, only one point away from taking 2nd place! During their trip, the students were also able to visit museums, learn about Canadian cuisine and visit Notre Dame Basilica/Cathedral. I am proud of the team for representing Mesa College.

### The Stand: Farmers Market

Mesa is proud to debut "[The Stand: Farmer's Market](#)," created via a new partnership with Feeding San Diego. The Stand: Farmers Market grand opening will be on Thursday, April 19, 2018 from 3:00 – 5:00 p.m. in the Sunrise Plaza, adjacent to Mesa Commons, where students and members of the Mesa community will have access to free food, including fresh produce. The initiative is part of Mesa College's effort on "Taking a Stand Against Hunger." Free reusable bags will be given to the first 150 guests. Various additional resources will be available at the event, including representatives from the CalFresh program – which provides free money for food to eligible students. 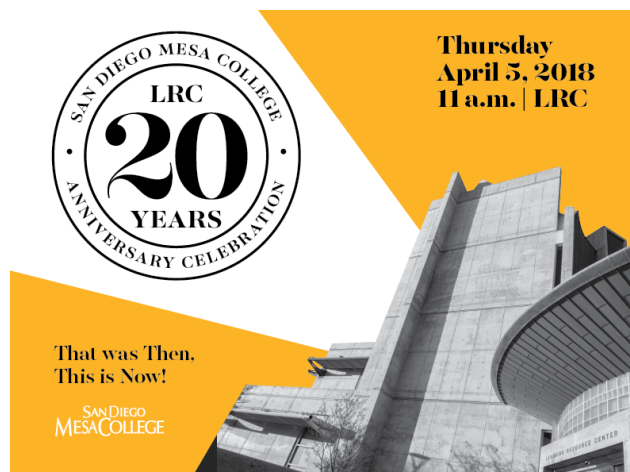
### Canyon Day – 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

This year, Mesa College will be hosting the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of [Canyon Day](#) on April 14 – an event dedicated to clearing and cleaning up Tecolote Canyon. The event starts with an informational lecture led by City Park Rangers about protecting local natural areas and preventing pollution. Students, staff and faculty then head into the canyon to remove trash and invasive species that are harmful to the surrounding ecosystem. Volunteers get a free commemorative t-shirt and can earn community service credit. This is an important event for Mesa and the surrounding community, so I hope that you can join us.

### Mesa College Celebrates the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Scholarship Awards Ceremony

Each year, Mesa College awards hundreds of scholarships to our students for their hard work, and we celebrate them at our annual Scholarship Awards Ceremony.
