Enrollment is UP and We are Off to a Great Start!

A Big Thank You to everyone on campus for their assistance in working with students and getting them to their classes the first week of the semester. Our collective work has really paid off as Mesa College's headcount and enrollment for Fall 2016 are up over the same time from the Fall of 2015. We are offering an additional 43 sections this fall compared to last fall with a total for the fall semester of 2,368 total sections. Mesa's FTES total for the fall semester has increased by 1.5% in FTES over the Fall 2015. Our headcount this semester is up about 5% over the Fall of 2015 meaning that 1,144 additional students are attending this fall and our current headcount is 23,427. Much of our enrollment growth is coming from online instruction.

The strength of our campus is how well we work together and this no more evident that the work that we do the first week of each semester in welcoming students back to our campus and helping them get off to a successful start to the semester. Every person on this campus plays a vital role in this work and a number of students have commented as to how good it feels to be at Mesa.

At long last Mesa College has a campus center worthy of its students and state- of-the- art college campus. Already this new building is fast becoming the place to be. New food options from our food services folks, and the beautiful new Culinary Outlook, with both the MFusion lunch service and Gourmet dinners on Wednesday and Thursday evenings, offers delicious reasons to stay on campus. The new conference rooms are already busy and offer the opportunities for more people to attend our college meetings.

Print and Mail services and the Stockroom are also in this new space, along with our beautiful new bookstore and the new outdoor Java Jive.

We are working on some additional shade options to create more seating; look for those soon.

On Wednesday, September 14th, we will have the official Grand Opening at 10 a.m. in the outdoor breezeway between the bookstore and cafeteria - join us!



Remembering Jan Ellis

Jan served as a faculty member for over 33 years, beginning her career as an adjunct in 1980. Jan taught in many areas of Dance, including Dance Repertoire, Jazz Dance & Performance, Lighting Design for Dance, Sound Design for Dance, and Choreography. She served as the Department Chair for

Physical Education, Dance and Athletics from 2012 – 2015, which was an extremely challenging position with accreditation and legislative changes which she fulfilled with great proficiency. She also took the lead in coordinating the SDCCD revision of the Physical Education, Health, and Dance curriculum as well as wrote the initial Program Review for the Dance Department to document the current practices as well as the future goals to ensure the success, retention and persistence of students in the dance classes.

Jan was also involved in many areas of the Dance Community, including leading intensive Dance and Movement Workshops for Educators every summer and heading the Mesa College Dance Company which offered bi-annual main stage performance opportunities. Jan also directed and produced concerts each semester which included guest choreographers to work with the students.
