# **Ethnic Studies Requirement**

#### Area F Ethnic Studies

CSU The California State University

3 semester units (4 quarter units)

This lower-division, 3 semester (4 quarter) unit requirement fulfills <u>Education Code Section 89032</u>. The requirement to take a 3 semester (4 quarter) unit course in Area F shall not be waived or substituted.

To be approved for this requirement, courses shall have the following course prefixes: African American, Asian American, Latina/o American or Native American Studies. Similar course prefixes (e.g., Pan-African Studies, American Indian Studies, Chicana/o Studies, Ethnic Studies) shall also meet this requirement. Courses without ethnic studies prefixes may meet this requirement if cross-listed with a course with an ethnic studies prefix. Courses that are approved to meet this requirement shall meet at least 3 of the 5 the following core competencies. Campuses may add additional competencies to those listed.





6.7. Ethnic Studies. 1 course: 3 semester units, 4 quarter units. This course must be in ethnic studies or in a similar field provided that the course is cross-listed with ethnic studies.

The AAPI Studies Program provide students with opportunities:

- (1) to learn about the histories, struggles, contributions and diverse identities of Asian American Pacific Islander communities.
- (2) to engage in social activism, community-based and service-learning that positively impact our Asian American Pacific Islander communities within San Diego County and across the nation.





## Program Outcomes - Students will be able to

- Understand and use concepts such as race, racism, racialization, eurocentrism, white supremacy, imperialism, settler colonialism, sovereignty and self-determination in analyzing AAPI experience.
- Apply theory and knowledge produced by AAPI communities to describe the critical events, histories, cultures, intellectual traditions, contributions, lived-experiences and social struggles of those groups with a particular emphasis on agency and group-affirmation.
- Critically analyze the intersection of race and racism as they relate to class, gender, sexuality, religion, spirituality, national origin, immigration status, ability, sovereignty, language, and/or age in AAPI communities
- Critically review how struggle, resistance, racial and social justice, solidarity, and liberation, as experienced and enacted by AAPI communities are relevant to current and structural issues such as communal, national, international, and transnational politics as, for example, in immigration, reparations, and settler-colonialism policies
- Employ analytical, interpretive, critical thinking and leadership skills to develop responsible civic consciousness and engage in projects that promote greater social justice and equity, with particular attention to AAPI communities.


