BARC FACE

- 1. Where do BAPC funds come from?
 - a. BMR: Tunds are a product of enabligh funding locurors. There are two types of fund designations within the Codings, unrestricted general fand joildings discretionary/operational, and restricted general fund (growt and categorical designations). The unrestricted perition comes from two sources, a set-aske at the beginning of each fixed, type and a year-end recopating of unanced departmental budget. - 2. How are requested items approved for funding?
 - a. The Budgert allocation Recommerced too Covernition reviews and into requests based on the criteria and relating approved by the committee. Once accord by each individual BMIC remittee, the rating results are again reviewed and princitized by the critice committee. The precitized bit is brought to the Planning and institutional Effectiveness Committee and Precidents Calibert for service and approved. Uniforating, the handling decisions are determined by the President of the College, with input from executive staff and great-managers where appropriate. - 3. How is one notified if their request has been funded?
 - a. Once funding determinations have been reade, Administrative Services on behalf of BMR, will not do at an email to all who have submitted a request to notify them to access the partial where funded stars will be noted.
