

RealCollege Survey Results: Mesa vs. Statewide

• San Diego Mesa College received 1,510 responses to the spring 2023 survey. About two out of three Mesa students(66%) reported facing at least one basic needs insecurity, with 43% reporting food insecurity, 58% reporting housing insecurity, and 19% reporting having been homeless in the past year. Across all insecurities, Mesa is performing the same as or better than the state.

Spring 2023 RealCollege Survey Mesa Respondent Demographic Data





Spring 2023 RealCollege Survey - Students with Basic Needs Insecurity by Ethnicity




Spring 2023 RealCollege Survey Mesa Respondent Demographic Data (n=1510)




More female students participated in the RealCollege Survey, proportionately compared to the campus-wide general population. (67.2% vs.55.2%)


Spring 2023 RealCollege Survey: Student with Basic Needs Insecurity by Gender







 Average Course Success Rates in 2022-2023 among All Mesa Students, Nonparticipants of any SS, and STAND Participants



Mesa The Stand Users' Course Success Rate by Gender


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
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
Student Satisfaction with Basic Needs Center
