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
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

DEVELOP A COMMITTEE	Develop a committee centered on Latine student and employee success: Toni (Lead), Jesus, Jenn, Miguel





SUCCESS RATES OF KEY COURSES FOR OUR LARGEST MAJORS




What do all of these graphs have in common?

How did you manage the costs of mostly attending full-time?








