Legislative and Regulatory Updates October 4, 2022

The following bills have been flagged as "bills of interest" signed by Governor Newsom.

Bill	Name	Description
AB-102	Pupil attendance at community colleges: College and Career Access Pathways partnerships: county offices of education.	Remove the sunset date on the California College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) and allow county offices of education to enter into CCAP partnerships
AB-1187	Community colleges: tutoring.	Expand the type of noncredit courses eligible for state apportionment funds to include supervised tutoring for all credit and noncredit courses offered at the community colleges.
AB-1655	State holidays: Juneteenth.	Create a state holiday on June 15th to commemorate Juneteenth.
AB-1705	Seymour-Campbell Student Success Act of 2012: matriculation: assessment.	Prohibit colleges from placing and enrolling students in pretransfer-level math or English coursework except under very limited circumstances, provide clarifying amendments to current equitable placement practices consistent with existing regulations and guidance, and require colleges to utilize data and local research evidence to inform a student's placement and concurrent support.
AB-2881	Public postsecondary education: students with dependent children.	Require public higher education institutions to grant priority enrollment to student parents and ensure students have specified information to enroll in the California Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).
SB-1141	Public postsecondary education: exemption from payment of nonresident tuition.	Remove the two-year cap on full-time enrollment in credit courses that can be counted towards achieving AB 540 status and change the threshold to qualify from three to two years of full-time attendance.
AB-1942	Community colleges: funding: instructional service agreements with public safety agencies.	Require instruction provided by districts under instructional service agreements with public safety agencies to be funded under the apportionment formula used for instruction in career development and college preparation courses.

AB- 1232	<u>Community colleges:</u> nonresident tuition fees: English as a second language courses.	Add an exemption for payment of nonresident tuition fees at a California Community College to certain nonresident students who enroll in a credit English as a second language (ESL) course.
AB- 1958	<u>The Community College</u> <u>Student Access, Retention,</u> <u>and Debt Cancellation</u> <u>Program.</u>	Establish the Community College Student Access, Retention, and Debt Cancellation Program to support efforts to increase student retention rates and enrollment by engaging former community college students who may have withdrawn from a community college due to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
AB- 1998	<u>Community colleges:</u> nonresident tuition fees: Western Undergraduate Exchange.	Authorize the Board of Governors to enter the Western Undergraduate Exchange and allow certain community college districts to exempt certain out-of-state students from the mandatory nonresident fee requirement.
AB- 2459	Postsecondary education: student housing: data collection.	Require UCs, CSUs, and CCCs campuses that provide student housing to post specified data regarding the availability of student housing on the first day of every month.
AB- 2683	Postsecondary education: sexual violence and harassment: training and resources.	Require UCs, CSUs, and CCCs campuses to train students annually on sexual assault and harassment prevention.
AB- 2747	Public postsecondary education: tuition and fees: Team USA student athletes.	Entitle any Team USA athlete who trains in California in an elite level program approved by the United State Olympic and Paralympic Committee to resident classification for tuition purposes.
AB- 2810	Student nutrition: CalFresh: student eligibility: Federal Application for Student Aid data.	Require the CSU and CCCs to use FAFSA data to identify students who meet the income requirements of the CalFresh program.
SB-641	CalFresh for College Students Act.	Require the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) to convene a workgroup to improve access to CalFresh for college students and to submit a report to the Legislature with recommendations.
SB-851	<u>Cal Grant Program:</u> independent institutions of higher education.	Commencing with the 2022-23 award year, restructure the formula for determining the maximum Cal Grant award for independent institutions of higher education, conditioned on the achievement of an associate degree for transfer (ADT) targets, and expand Cal Grant awards to students attending those institutions.
