Mesa Pathways Report PCAB 11/05/2024

This year Mesa Pathways is concentrating on two primary projects. The first is to finish mapping the remainder of the award programs that are offered and the second is get the mapper up and running.

## **Mesa Success Coaches:**

The Mesa Success Coaches program is continuing to reach out in support of our students through email and text messaging throughout the semester.

Additionally, Dr. Ian Duckles will be presenting the research findings from a concerted effort with the Office of Institutional Effectiveness on the impact of the program on the students who participated in the 2023-24 Success Coaches trial to PCAB in November.

## Mesa Mapper:

Our team of counselors have completed the initial drafts of the remaining maps, which will give us a total of 90 maps for the initial build in Mapper. The team anticipate starting to send the maps to the departments for review the week of October 27<sup>th</sup>. Review and approval are hoped to be completed by mid-November. The team will then continue with mapping the remaining programs at Mesa, which will likely be approximately 110 additional maps. No deadline has been set for these to be completed currently. A big "THANK YOU" goes out to Cynthia Rico, Marisa Alioto, and Kari Parker for their continuous efforts in this important work.

The CCC Foundation and the District IT team are collaborating on setting up the vanity URL for San Diego Mesa to complete the development of the ghost URL for the mapper. It is anticipated that this project will be completed by early November. Thank you to Jordan Sage and George Wildberger from the District IT department for their support with this effort.

We have completed the data scrub of the programs and courses from the district and the data has been uploaded by the Foundation into the mapper program. Dean Shelly Hess informed us that there is an opportunity for the District to have the District's CalGETC data uploaded from Meta and imported into Mapper. The District and the Foundation are currently meeting to discuss this process and develop a timeline. We will wait for this process to be complete since all of Mesa's maps have been mapped to CalGETC.
