Mesa College's headcount for the fall semester is currently **21,475**, this is a 4% increase from this time last year (836 more students). We have increased our FTES as well, with 6,165 full-time equivalent students compared to 5,841 on the same day last fall. FTEF scheduled for the fall semester is marginally greater than last fall (384 to 381). Since Fall 2022, we have experienced steady growth in headcount and FTES totals.

Mesa College's headcount for the summer semester was **7,415**, which is slightly lower than last summer's **7,570** headcount. While headcount was reduced slightly, we did see an increase of 13 more FTES this summer compared to last with 1219 FTES compared to 1206 FTES in summer 2024. As the end of term summer processing completes and we move through the start of the fall semester, we will have final numbers to share.

Summer CRUISE celebrated its tenth anniversary by welcoming 500 additional students in July and August!

Our dedicated team of Peer Navigators continues to build meaningful connections that encourage new students to develop effective help-seeking skills while fostering a strong sense of belonging. Participants enjoyed the Resource Fair, took full advantage of meetings with counselors during RegLab, and successfully fulfilled their Promise requirements. Additionally, over 100 student-athletes met with the student-athlete counseling team to learn about NCAA and CCCAA eligibility requirements.





Each year, Mesa, City, and Miramar Colleges, along with Continuing Education and the District Offices, collaborate to create a vibrant float and community contingent for the San Diego Pride Parade, showcasing student creativity and voices. This year's theme, *Unbreakable Pride*, *Unshakeable Power*, earned SDCCD first place for "Best Use of Theme, Community Contingent" at the 2025 parade. This award reflects the dedication of our students, staff, and planning committee, and we are incredibly proud of this achievement.

Club Advisor Training




