Standing in Solidarity with Los Angeles: Supporting Our Community During Wildfire Season

Our hearts go out to the Los Angeles community affected by the ongoing wildfires. We stand in solidarity with those facing the challenges of this natural disaster and extend our deepest gratitude to the brave firefighters and first responders working tirelessly to protect lives and homes.

As a reminder, the San Diego Community College District offers valuable wellness resources through the <u>VEBA</u> <u>Resource Center</u>. Employees are encouraged to reach out to supervisors or managers for support, while students can connect with <u>resources</u> like The Stand, Counseling, Student Health Services, and resiliency funds.

The current wildfires are a reminder that wildfire season in Southern California is now a year-round reality. It's important for all of us to stay prepared by creating evacuation plans and keeping open lines of communication with family and community members. For the most up to date weather alerts please visit the National Weather Service website. Sign up for emergency alerts at https://protect.genasys.com to receive up-to-date information regarding fire evacuations.

In preparation for the upcoming Spring 2025 semester, please see below parking information for students, faculty, and classified professionals:

Student parking:

- City, Mesa, and Miramar Colleges:
 - o Student permits are not required to park in student spaces during Intersession.
 - \circ Student permit enforcement will be suspended for the beginning of the Spring semester (February $3^{rd} 14th$)
- CE Campuses:
 - There is no suspended enforcement for the month of January in student spaces
 - Student permit enforcement will be suspended for the beginning of the Spring semester (January 29th – February 14th
- Warnings may be issued at all locations February 10th 14th for permit violations
- Full enforcement begins at all locations on February 18th
- All other violations will still be enforced, only student permit violations will be suspended

Staff parking:

- Warnings may be issued for staff permit violations through February 8th to allow time for all staff members to obtain their virtual permit
- Staff/faculty permits that expired on December 31, 2024, should be displayed and will be honored through February 14th to park in staff spaces.
- NANC employees are able to obtain temporary virtual parking permits through MyPortal. NANC
 employees should make note of the expiration date of their temporary permit and will need to
 obtain new permits for each semester. Students are not eligible for staff permits.

A Parking Services staff member will be visiting each college campus the first week of the semester to assist with permit distribution. These staff members will be at the following locations:

- City College Accounting
- Mesa College Outreach
- Miramar College Accounting

The current parking permits for staff and faculty will expire on December 31, 2024. Starting in January 2025, the District will be utilizing virtual parking permits instead of physical ones. Attached are the instructions to register via Employee Self – Service.

Please complete the application no later than **February 8, 2025**, to ensure you are covered once your physical permit and the District grace period expires.

While only virtual permits will be used at our SDCCD locations, physical permits will be available for those with reciprocity to use while parked at other SDICCCA colleges and will be available for pick-up from Parking Services or the Mesa, Miramar, or City College police stations. Please note the process for obtaining guest parking passes remains the same at this time.





