WOW (Word of the Week) - FTEF (full-time equivalent faculty):

- The portion of a full-time load, which each particular class represents
- 1 FTEF = 1 instructor teaching 15 equated hours per week for 1 semester
- If a full-time faculty member has a load that consists of 15 lecture hours, a 3-hour class represents 20% of that load

Office of the President Updates

I had the pleasure of serving on a *Presidential Equity Champions* panel at the bi-annual CCCCIO Conference today. The panel focused on *Advancing Equity through Intentional and Collaborative Leadership*.

SDSU recently received a \$1 Million USDA Grant to Support Sustainable Food and Agriculture Training for Latino Students. Mesa College will partner with SDSU to create a pipeline of students from community college through graduate school. "By opening this program to Mesa College students, we can spark excitement in the research process, build confidence for conducting research, and provide ways for students to see themselves at the next stage of their education," said Professor Waverly Ray, who explained that more than half of the Mesa student body experiences food insecurity themselves. "This program demonstrates how research can be leveraged to alleviate this real-world problem," she added. Selected students will receive financial support to take the team-taught class at SDSU and for doing research at Mesa's vegetable garden. If they eventually transfer to SDSU and continue in the program, they will receive special counseling, scholarship opportunities and mentoring from both the faculty and peers.

SDCCD has partnered with WeeCare to provide access to a local and national network of childcare providers at discounted rates. Tomorrow at 12:00pm, SDCCD will host a 30 minute information session with representatives from WeeCare to guide employees through their services and answer questions. The presentation is titled: *Learning more about WeeCare: Employee Childcare Benefits*. Attendees can register in advance for this webinar here.
