Office of Instruction Updates

The Community Care Licensing Department (CCLD) performed an unannounced site visit last week at the Mesa Child Development Center. The CDC was proud to report that there were no findings/no violations issued during the visit. Areas inspected include health and safety, classrooms and playgrounds, staff and children document files, child attendance sheets, food storage, cleaning supply storage, and building

ingress and egress.

In support of the Early Childhood Education and Education Pathways on our campus, Professor Ida Cross created a Child Development/Education Club for students and is serving as the faculty mentor. She recruited students by hosting a table at previous campus events. The club's first meeting was on October 14 in the yard of the Child Development Center. Students stayed after the meeting to decorate the playground for the Fall Festival, which took place on October 26.

Students attend a 4-part workshop series culminating in a finished project.
