The percentage of official census enrolled students in a primary term who received a grade notation of A, B, C, D, F, P, NP, I, W or RD, and who enrolled in at least one course in the subsequent like Primary term (Fall 18 to Fall 19 or Spring 19 to Spring 20) and received a grade notation of A, B, C, D, F, P, NP, I, W or RD. Students who earn a degree during the initial term are excluded.
