Five Mesa Students Awarded Prestigious Gilman Scholarships for Summer 2025 Study Abroad!

This year's cohort of Gilman Scholars will be embarking on transformative academic journeys abroad. Four students will study in Japan, immersing themselves in the country's rich culture and academic opportunities, while one student will head to England to explore its dynamic educational environment. With 16 students applying, the high number of awardees highlights the strong caliber of our applicants and the dedication they've shown in pursuing global education opportunities.

During this semester, the HSI Title III STEM E<sup>3</sup> grant sponsored two workshop series for students. Biology Professor, Dr. Michael Williams facilitated a bio-chem workshop series where students learned advanced biochemical techniques that will make them lab ready and marketable for a bio-industry job. Engineering Professor, Dr. Phuong Truong facilitated an engineering workshop series where students learned basic programming and electronics with Arduino, and created final projects including robotic cars and soil moisture detection. Students receive certificates of completion at the end of the series and are equipped with new skills that will assist them in their STEM fields.






