VP O'Connor will be attending the Common Course Numbering (CCN) Taskforce meeting on Thursday.

This week, Mesa College will launch our Invention and Inclusive Innovation (i3) Initiative Pilot Project. 22 Students are enrolled in this initiative. i3 is designed to develop 21<sup>st</sup> century workforce skills while solving community problems, scale experiential learning for students, teach students about using the entrepreneurial mindset as a skill, and learning as a cohort in an interdisciplinary environment while building confidence.

### Office of Resource Development Updates

The scholarship cycle has now been closed to students and opened it to review. 42 people signed up to volunteer to review scholarships, and 808 students applied. A big thank you to Student Affairs, MT2C Writing Center, and many more who helped promote scholarships!

We are working with corporate donor RoomChazer to develop additional volunteer opportunities in support of students.

We recently met with prospective Board Members; Christine Lee of California Coast Credit Union, and Dr. Pamela Luster, President Emerita / Luster Higher Ed Group.

### **Student Services Updates**

Dean Vicki Miller and Claudia Perkins from Student Affairs will host the San Diego Colleges and Universities Student Conduct Conference. This is an event where all San Diego Region Conduct Officers collaborate to discuss hot topics including restorative practices, mental health, artificial intelligence, student rights and responsibilities, and more.

On Friday, Mesa Outreach will host approximately 100 Madison High School students joining us for workshops and a campus tour.

<u>Success Story:</u> Sergio, an international student from Brazil, returned to the United States after six months of travel ranging from Brazil to Mexico. We are happy to hear that he has successfully completed all of the I2O paperwork. This is a difficult process to complete quickly. We are excited to have him back, and he plans to complete two more semesters at Mesa to finish his two-year degree in Business Administration.

Success Story: Tiger, a UCSD international student from New Zealand, was academically disqualified from UCSD and was asked to attend Mesa for one semester before requesting to return to UCSD. He was referred to Mesa the day before the deadline to receive, process, and pay for permission codes. He successfully requested and received seven permission codes from Mesa College instructors, and relayed

that his experience with us was wonderful. Many thanks to all the faculty and staff who provided immediate support to ensure the student successfully registered for spring classes.
