Office of Instruction Updates

We are excited to present our "African in Context" Reception, being held this tomorrow from 4:00pm – 7:00pm, including light refreshments and a performance by Teye Sa Thiosanne African Drum & Dance Company. Dr. Denise Rogers and Mesa College Art Gallery Director Alessandra Moctezuma, along with the Mesa College Art Gallery Team and the Mesa College Museum Studies program, are presenting the exhibit, a rare presentation of African art displayed as the pieces were historically used. The pieces displayed in the exhibit are from the San Diego Mesa College World Art Collection, from regions including Ghana, Mali, Yoruba, and the Democratic Republic of Congo, among others. There are several shrines constructed in the gallery, many of which honor a "great mother," or the power or spirit of women. The exhibit runs through February 23, 2023. On exhibit in the 2nd Floor Student Art Gallery is *Beyond the*

Vision - Student Art Exhibition. Curated by Mesa students, this intimate exhibition explores transformative and healing ways art can be a vessel for release within the Black community. A lecture in the gallery hosted by Dr. Denise Rogers titled *SPIRITUALITY AND FEMININE POWER IN AFRICAN ART*, will take place Tuesday, February 14, from 11:15AM - 12:15PM, in FA-103. The Art Gallery hours are Monday through Thursday, from 12pm – 5pm or by appointment.

Over the weekend, Mesa hosted its first "Game Jam" in partnership with the International Game Developers Association and the Global Game Jam. Over 40 professional and student game developers came together to create games under this year's theme "Roots". During this three day event, seven unique games were developed at Mesa for the Global Gaming Community.

The Mesa Impactship Program (MIP) hosted the spring on-boarding of Mesa College interns in-person on Friday, and virtually on Monday. Over 70 students were accepted for Spring 2023 to join the program out of over 160 applicants. Eligible Mesa students may receive a one-time, \$1,000 stipend, or hourly compensation for student workplace training and enrollment in a Work Experience or Directed Clinical Practice (DCP) course. Funding is intended to support students with reducing or eliminating out-of-pocket expenses such as childcare, equipment, fees, meals, professional attire, & more. MIP students will also be provided with additional career preparation activities, resume support, networking opportunities, and connections to additional job opportunities while participating. Office of Resource Development Updates

Director Stellmacher and President Hands had a campus visit with the California Coast Credit Union team last week.

We launched the next step of our Scholarship process, gathering feedback and setting up Review Committees for our 117 scholarships.

\$13,000 was recently awarded in Innovation Grants and an additional \$13,648 in support was leveraged from the campus community to secure funding for 83% of the amount requested during the 2023 Innovation Grant Cycle.

Student Services Updates

Admissions

- Mesa has 1,783 CCAP enrollments for Spring 2023.
- Mesa received 16 potential enrollments via the California Virtual Campus Online Education Initiative (CVC-OEI) from the following colleges: Bakersfield College, Chaffey College, Compton College, De Anza College, Foothill College, Lake Tahoe Community College, Santa Ana College, Santiago Canyon College, and Ventura College.

Counseling

- Promise counselors will facilitate virtual and in-person hotspots for students throughout the spring semester. In-person counseling hotspots will be held in the Assessment and Testing Center and in the Counseling Office.
- The Counseling Department will be collaborating with Outreach to provide abbreviated education plans to incoming high school students from four of Mesa College's feeder high schools. Students will visit Mesa College to go through the pre-enrollment stages and obtain an abbreviated education plan by meeting with a counselor. Campus visits will happen through March.

The International Student Program facilitated the process for 16 new international students to be admitted to Mesa College for the spring semester.

- Borderless Scholars Workshops: We are inviting all Borderless Scholars to join us for the "Spring 2023 Virtual / In-Person Borderless Scholars Workshops".
