Mesa College alumnus Mario Romero made history as part of a team from Intuitive Machines whose uncrewed lander, as the first privately owned spacecraft, touched down on the lunar surface.

Mario attended Mesa College from 2013-15 as an Astronomy/Astrophysics major. He was active in our Mesa community: he was active in establishing the Student Veteran Organization and advocated for creating a Veterans Resource Center. He also dedicated his time to helping the homeless and food insecure veterans and children.

After Mesa, he transferred to Columbia University and graduated with a bachelors in pure mathematics, then went on to the University of Houston, Clear Lake to obtain a masters in systems engineering. He is now an Assembly, Integration, and Test Engineer for Intuitive Machines.
