# WOW (Word of the Week) – Term Length Multiplier (TLM)

TLM is the number of weeks in a primary term with at least three days of instruction and/or examination. The term length multiplier for each college is set by the CCC Chancellor's Office based on the college's academic calendar. Maximum TLM is 17.5 for semesters and 11.67 for quarters. San Diego Mesa College's TLM is 16.

## Office of the President Updates

Members of San Diego's congressional delegation, including Rep. Sara Jacobs, Rep. Scott Peters, and Rep. Juan Vargas, hosted a Press Conference at Mesa College on Monday to present SDCCD with a check for \$3.4 million from the U.S. Congress. This check will benefit district students in the following 3 areas:

- \$1.2 million to better serve lesbian, gay, and transgender students
- \$1 million for an initiative to expand services to former foster youth
- \$1.2 million for new and expanded centers serving undocumented students

This Friday, I will visit the CBS 8 news studio for a live interview to speak about the Jumpstart event this weekend, the San Diego Promise Program, and the state of higher education.

## Office of Instruction Updates

### Office of Institutional Effectiveness Updates

Dean Shelly Hess (SDCCD), Program Director Connie Renda (Mesa HIM program), and Acting Dean Hai Hoang (Mesa IE Office) collaborated with Bakersfield College, Rio Hondo College, and Golden West College to host the first-ever statewide workshop on Bachelor's Degree Programs at Golden West College last week. The purpose of the event is to support new colleges who are early on in their journey of offering the Bachelor's Degree Programs. The event sold out, with over 160 registered attendees from approximately 50 colleges in the state. VC Susan Topham, Dean Shelly Hess, Dean Victor Devore, Program Director Connie Renda, and Acting Dean Hai Hoang also presented at the event, in order to share information about student services, scheduling, curriculum, financial aid, and data/research.

#### Office of Resource Development Updates

The Office of Resource Development recently received \$905 of support, which was inspired by the Pride Center Grand Opening, and included generous support from the Trustees. We have also completed the 2022 tax letters, so if you donated last year, please look to receive your letter in the mail either via inter-office mail or to your home address.

#### Student Services Updates

Mesa College has 22 counselors who will be participating in the SWF Counselor Institute. The counselor institute is designed to foster understanding and awareness of Career Technical Education/Career Education (CTE/CE); learn how to use labor market information (LMI) and career exploration in advising students; use inquiry, evidence-based decision-making, and continuous improvement to examine services provided to students; support counseling faculty in building relationships and collaborating with CTE/CE instructional faculty and institutional researchers; and inspire counseling from a culturally inclusive perspective.

The Dreamer Resource Center, along with the Borderless Scholars, continue to facilitate their Spring 2023 Virtual/In-Person Borderless Scholars Workshops for students. The workshops will take place throughout the spring semester. For more information, please visit our website <u>here</u>.

### Administrative Services

The Wayfinding Project is in progress, and we expect the project to be finished by late summer or early fall. There will be fencing surrounding the areas where new signage will be installed.
