The Construction Management Association of America (CMAA) San Diego Chapter invited Mesa's Building Construction program for a site visit for the UCSD Theatre District Project. Dr. Bashar Haddad organized for Building Construction students to tour the buildings for this expansive project with five high-rise towers and a multi-story parking deck. This project will feature over 2000 beds of undergraduate student housing and over a 135,000 sf of additional space for lectures, conferences, administration and other functions. This was really great opportunity for students to get some exposure to a large project, learn how large management teams are setup, hear about design-build delivery method, and generally walk and learn about construction!









Cross-Border Flows - Fashion Redux is an annual design competition for students in the Fashion Program at San Diego Mesa College.

This year's exhibit is based on the idea that San Diego's geographical location has fostered a unique cultural exchange seen through a variety of examples from the History Center's Historic Textile Collection. Students in the Fashion 145 class (Clothing Design Through Draping) were inspired by clothing of San Diego's famed Don Diego, Ballet Folklorico, and their own family cross-border family heritage. Four student finalists showcased their designs and skills in the evening event at the San Diego History Center. The evening was capped by a student Q & A panel from patrons and a people choice's winner.
