Office of the President Updates

This Friday at 2:00 p.m., we will be celebrating the wonderful accomplishments of our graduates at the San Diego Mesa College 2023 Commencement Ceremony! Congratulations to all our amazing graduates on your success!

On Tuesday, President Hands and Vice Presidents O'Connor, Legaspi, and Maxey met with UCSD's Associate Vice Chancellor of Enrollment Management Jim Rawlins, Executive Director of Admissions Blia Yang, and Executive Director of Financial Aid and Scholarships Silvia Marquez, to talk about the vision for the coming years of the partnership between UCSD and Mesa College.

Office of Instruction Updates

There is a lot of excitement happening for our STEM Peer Mentors! Nine of our peer mentors have been accepted into various University of California schools: 3 have committed to UCSD, 2 have committed to UC Berkeley, while the others will make their decisions after touring some of the other UC campuses later this month. Additionally, one peer mentor was awarded a full-ride scholarship to the University of San Diego via the Constance M. Carroll Scholarship Award and another received and accepted a full ride to Harvard University.

As of week 14 of this semester, our peer mentor program has helped 671 unique students for a total of 2,952 instances. This data will be disaggregated over the summer.

Last weekend, faculty librarian Dr. Alison Gurganus presented at Stanford University her year-long work as a faculty fellow in the Education Partnership for Internationalizing Curriculum (EPIC) program with the Stanford University Global Studies Division. The EPIC Community College Faculty Fellowship program brings together a cohort of community college faculty and academic staff from various disciplines (humanities, social sciences, mathematics, hard sciences, international programs, etc.) to work collaboratively with Stanford staff for one academic year (August-May) on self-designed projects aimed at internationalizing core curricula and developing global competencies among community college students.
