Office of the President Updates

President Hands, VP O'Connor, VP Maxey and Dean Diaz toured the new Youth Transition Campus (YTC) in Kearny Mesa. The tour was provided by Principal Finney and Directors Kirkenhall and Austin. YTC is a space where justice-involved youth get the services and support they need to re-enter our communities. The campus provides hope and transformational opportunities through treatment, education, support and career training in a beautiful, new, state-of-the-art facility, here in Kearny Mesa. This visit will serve as a foundation to expand our existing partnership in equity infused and intentional ways.

Last week, we learned that one of our student-athletes and her family of six lost everything in a house fire. In collaboration with the



President's Office, Foundation, Basic Needs, Athletics and Student Services, we were able to present the student and her family with a \$2000 check from our Resiliency Fund, hundreds of dollars in gas and food gift cards, clothing and a myriad of other items to support them during this time.

As the Fall semester draws close, so does the end of the 4/10 work schedule. The 4/10 schedule will conclude on August 11.

I am saddened by the series of events that took place on our campus early Tuesday morning when a vehicle pursuit involving the San Diego Police Department ended with an officer-involved shooting at Mesa College. We do not believe the individuals involved were connected with Mesa College or SDCCD in any way. Police secured the area and there was no ongoing public safety concern at Mesa College or the surrounding areas. Accordingly, all regularly scheduled classes, services, activities, and work proceeded. Messages were sent to the DL and to students enrolled in onsite classes through multiple modalities to ensure they were aware and updated throughout the day. While we did all of the "things" to manage this crisis, we never lost sight that lives were lost and others will be forever changed as a result of what occurred in our space. Such incidents serve as a reminder of how precious our lives and time are and how important it is for us to pour into our students (and each other) by creating conditions that matter for them to be seen, valued, supported and to thrive, every chance we get.
