The Mesa Olympians Football Team defeated #3 Ventura College at their first home game over the weekend, with a score of 35 to 20, to improve to 2 to 0 for the season so far. In a collaboration between our Veterans Counselors and the Transfer Career Center, a UC TAG/TAP Workshop will be held within the Veteran Success Center today from 10:00am to 12:00pm. The Transfer Center will also collaborate with General Counseling to host transfer application workshops Monday through Friday. From Monday through Thursday these workshops will be held in Zoom format, and Fridays will be held in-person.

Transfer Day will be held on October 13, 2022. Students will have the opportunity to discuss transfer planning and articulation with more than 40 California State Universities (CSU), Universities of California (UC), Independent/Private Colleges/Universities, and Out-of-State Colleges/Universities. College representatives will provide information regarding the application process, financial aid, and programs and scholarships available.

The Mesa Career Center will assist in hosting a district-wide job fair on Thursday, November 17, aligning with National Career Development week, which takes place from November 14 through November 18. Students will be invited via Handshake. More information will be announced at a later date.

Students can receive support with their resume and cover letter by scheduling a peer-to-peer appointment with a Career Ambassador. The <u>Career Ambassador Program</u> (CAP) meets students where they are in their career journey by providing peer-to-peer coaching sessions on job searching, résumé writing, cover letter writing, interview preparation, and other career readiness resources.
