## **Office of Instruction Updates**

Dr. Isabel O'Connor, Vice President of Instruction at San Diego Mesa College, has been appointed as a CIO representative on The Common Course Numbering Task Force. The Task Force is charged with working collaboratively across the California Community Colleges and its key stakeholders, to develop an implementation plan for fulfilling the AB-1111 mandate, to ensure that general education and transfer pathway courses across all community colleges have the same course number through a student-facing common course numbering system.

Last week, Mesa College collaborated with the San Diego County Office of Education to host the regional portion of *Arts Empower: San Diego Mega Conference*. This annual event attracts educators, administrators, and advocates from K-12 and community colleges, in all aspects of arts education.
