The San Diego Community College District's Board of Trustees has unanimously agreed to place a \$3.5-billion bond measure on the November ballot to fund critical construction and modernization projects that will ensure the region's largest provider of workforce training and higher education continues to be a leader in driving the San Diego economy.

Based on the updated California Department of Public Health Guidance as of 4/2024, CalOSHA Non-ETS as of 5/22/2024, and District process please do the following, should you test positive for COVID.

If you are asymptomatic, you are not considered infectious, and therefore do not need to isolate or be excluded from work. Should you develop symptoms, the guidance below would need to be followed.

Infectious period is defined as a minimum of 24 hours from the day of symptoms onset.

If you test positive for COVID-19, you may return to work if 24 hours have passed with no fever, without the use of fever-reducing medications, and your symptoms are mild and improving. You may test on day 5, but it is not required.

You may test positive on day 5, and continue to test positive for up to 90 days. Please use item 3 as your guidance for returning to on-site activity.

After isolation, the District does not require a negative test to return to work.

CalOSHA does require that you continue to wear a mask for a full 10 days from symptom onset, when around other people.

If you would like face masks or hand sanitizer for your office, please reach out to Shipping & Receiving to coordinate delivery.


Research Showcase at SDSU Coastal and Marine Institute Laboratory




