Mesa College attended the District's Arizona State University Dreamscape Informational meeting on Monday, where they learned about academic learning through a virtual reality setting. This technology is currently showing improvement in student performance, with students in the Dreamscape Learning courses 1.7 times more likely to receive an "A" on their assignments compared to their non-DSL peers.

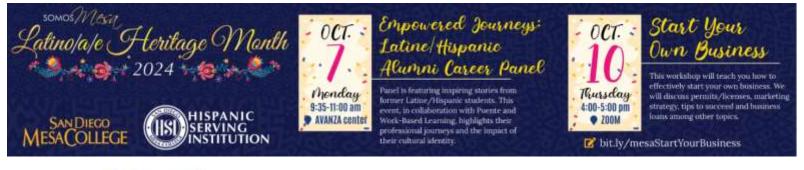
