IIII: SB 554	
COMMENTS	<u>SB 554 Bill</u> -
	 The CE workgroup discussed SB554, "existing law authorizes the governing board of a school district to allow pupils whom the district has determined would benefit from advanced scholastic or vocational work to attend community college as special part-time or full-time students, subject to parental permission. This bill authorizes the governing board of a school district overseeing an

adult education program or the governing board of a community college district overseeing a non-credit program to authorize a student pursuing a high school diploma or a high school equivalency certificate to enroll as a special part-time student at a community college, as provided. The bill credits or reimburses the community college through the apportionment process for the student's attendance at the college, as specified.
Cat Prindle from West City Continuing Education shared the current process a CE student has to take in order to enroll part time at the college. Some of the questions that arose were: Are part time students eligible for aid, and what other resources are available for students who are part time. Our goal is to ensure this information is readily available on the CE Mesa website.
