





Humanizing Language

Students who have experienced foster care

- Understand foster care is one experience of many that may have shaped their identity
- May understand some struggles students have faced
- Humanizing
- Attentive to individual student needs

Foster Youth


- Does not honor student full humanity
- Prescriptive narratives
- Assumptions
- Identity is embedded in relation to systems
- Permeates students' existence

Person impacted by the justice system, person with disabilities (varying abilities), person experiencing homelessness / food insecurity, person with a history of substance use

- Self awareness,
 developing anti racist

Intersectionality

- Possess multiple identities that have historically and continue to be oppressed
- Compounding Oppression

Humanizing Language

- Be mindful of the language that we use
- Check in with colleagues, friends, and family

Power and Privilege

Understand that our identities grant us privileges and power regardless if we acknowledge it.

By using out power to dismantle systemic racism we move toward an equitable world


