




FALL 2021 HIGHLIGHTS

STUDENT SUCCESS TEAM ROADSHOWS


- In Fall 2021, the Student Success Team project team conducted "road show" workshops to obtain feedback from the campus community regarding frameworks for the Student Success Teams
- 100+ community members participated
- Of the 4 frameworks presented, there was a clear preference for Academic and Career Pathways (ACPs).
- Stage is set for more planning to occur in Spring for a Fall 2022 pilot.

FALL 2021 PATHWAYS PROJECT GRANTS FUNDING 8 projects were awarded for a total of over \$39,000 in funding.

Awardees included projects in STAR TRIO, Career Center, and Rising Scholars


MESA PATHWAYS GLOSSARY

This tool is designed to help each college assess how far along we are toward adopting essential Guided Pathways practices at scale.





WHY ARE STUDENT SUCCESS TEAMS (SST) IMPORTANT?

Mesa Pathways Opportunity Statement:

We recognize that the educational journey for some students can be lengthy, confusing, costly and inequitable.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENT SUCCESS TEAMS

More intentional delivery of academic and student support services to achieve student success.

Identify students who can benefit from additional supports and deliver resources to them.

Well-designed student success teams will shrink equity gaps.

Increase student and employee engagement in the broader college community.

Provide a framework for organizing and streamlining all of these efforts.



STUDENT SUCCESS TEAMS ROADSHOW RECOMMENDATIONS

- Utilize Academic and Career Pathways (ACPs) as the organizing structure.
- 2. SST's will be another source for student success, working in tandem with existing affinity groups.
- 3. Creation of a Student Success Teams Project Team under the Mesa Pathways Committee.
- Develop Student Success Teams structure during Spring
 2022 with aim for a pilot SST in Fall 2022.

STUDENT SUCCESS TEAMS: SPRING GOALS

1

Create structure for the 9 teams organized around the Academic & Career Pathways. 2

Determine the composition of each Team.

3

Set the term of service for each Team and develop a plan for recruitment. 4

Begin to develop a "Student Success Team Handbook" to guide and eventually institutionalize SST's 5

Present a proposal to pilot a Student Success Team for Fall 2022 at PCAB on April 19, 2022.

How do we ensure students feel supported by Academic & Career Pathways and not overwhelmed by them?




How will the Teams communicate with students and vice versa?
