UC San Diego Seven Colleges

Minimum UC Admission Criteria

To be considered for UC admission as a Junior, you must fulfill the following requirements:

- Complete 60 semester (90 quarter) UC transferable units
- Complete the UC-transferable college courses below with a C grade or better in each course. Each course must be 3 UC transferable semester (4-5 quarter) units.
 - **Follow IGETC Pattern to satisfy and be eligible to apply to most UC campuses**
 - 2 English composition
 - 1 mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning
 - 4 courses from at least 2 of the following:
 - Arts and humanities
 - Physical and biological sciences
 - Social and behavioral sciences
- Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA in UC-transferable courses and good academic standing
- Major preparation courses*

****At least 60 Transferable Units must be completed by the end of Spring semester for FALL TRANSFER****

Transfer Major Preparation

- Some Departments at UC San Diego will require major preparation courses for admission
- Applicants from these specific majors will be screened during the admissions process for:
 - Number of preparatory coursework completed
 - Grades earned
 - Cumulative GPA



Students planning to transfer must complete the minimum major preparation coursework to be considered for admission into the majors listed below. Any major not listed below does not require screening for minimum major preparation; however, applicants are encouraged to complete major preparation. Applicants for the following departments will be screened for the number of preparatory courses completed, the grades earned in that coursework and the cumulative GPA. All major preparation screening courses must be completed with a C (2.0) or better grade unless otherwise noted.

Please note that the courses listed on assist.org are for preparation for your major. The courses for the majors listed below are the minimum screening requirements for admission into that major.

UC Transfer Pathways

- Gives a clear roadmap to prepare for your major and be well positioned to apply for any UC campus
- If there is no pathway for your chosen major or the campus you want is not listed in the pathway for your chosen major, you can find the information you need and review assist.org to identify major preparation requirements

UC Transfer Pathways Guide

UC San Diego University Link

- Guaranteed admission program with between local San Diego Community Colleges and UC San Diego

- **Eligibility:**

- First-year student at a local partner community college
- Family income of \$40,000 or less
- Completion of FAFSA or CA Dream Application to determine income verification

OR

- Student veteran, active duty service member, or current/former foster youth
- Attending a local partner community college regardless of first-time college status (No time limit)

University Link Admission Requirements

- Complete a minimum of 60 UC-transferable semester units (90 quarter units) by end of spring term prior to fall enrollment at UC San Diego.
- Earn a cumulative 3.5 UC GPA
- Meet UC eligibility by completing these UC-transferable college courses:
 - 2 English composition
 - 1 mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning
 - 4 courses from at least 2 of the following areas:
 - Arts and humanities
 - Physical and biological sciences
 - Social and behavioral sciences
- Both of the UC English courses and the UC math course must be completed by the end of fall term prior to fall enrollment at UC San Diego.
- Complete ALL U-Link Program requirements prior to admission

Transfer Admission Planner

Welcome to the UC Transfer Admissions Planner! This online tool is designed to help prospective UC students transferring from California community colleges track and plan their course work, including those students who are seeking a Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) with one of the six participating UC campuses.

How to use the online planner

Students can use the Transfer Admissions Planner to enter their course work (completed and planned) from the very beginning of their college careers, or at any point when they decide to transfer to a UC campus. The planner helps students track their progress toward meeting UC's minimum requirements, and allows UC staff to communicate important information to prospective transfer students. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with their community college counselor, as this tool does not replace advising students receive at their college.

The information students enter in the planner allows UC staff to direct appropriate information to students quickly. All information collected is considered confidential and is shared only with students' community colleges, UC admissions officers, and UC academic preparation professionals.

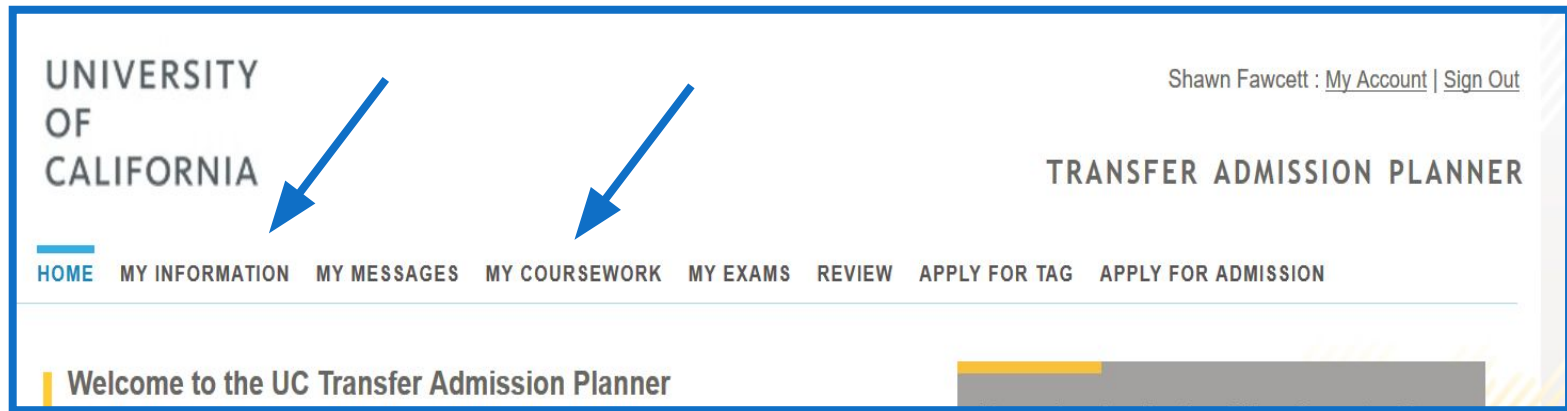

- You can update your application anytime until it is time to submit

Transfer Admission Planner (TAP)

- **My Information** – Personal, Demographics, Schools Attended, UC Campuses Applying To, Support Programs
- **My Messages** – Receive updates from CC Counselor or UC Admissions
- **My Coursework** – Enter courses, grades, units completed
 - *Transferable Courses* – Listed automatically from ASSIST
 - *Non-Transferable* – Enter manually as shown on transcript
 - Report gaps in education, deficient grades, & repeated courses
- **My Exams** – Enter AP or IB exams for college credit

October 1	Filing period for FAFSA and Cal Grant Verification Form opens for applicants to all terms (Filing period open through March 2, 2021)
November 1-30	Fall 2022 admission application filing period for all applicants*
January 6	Online application update opens for transfer applicants to report final fall grades and in-progress or planned coursework (priority deadline is January 31)
March 1	Notification of fall 2022 admission decisions begins
2	Deadline for applicants for all terms to submit FAFSA and Cal Grant GPA Verification Form
May 1	Notification of fall 2022 admission decisions complete
1-31	Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) application for winter/spring term
June 1	Deadline for admitted transfer students to submit Statement of Intent to Register (SIR)
July 1	For students admitted for fall 2022: Final, official transcripts must be sent to the campus admissions office. Transcripts must be postmarked or electronically submitted on or before July 1.
15	Official AP, IB examination results must be sent to the campus admissions office. Test scores must be postmarked or electronically submitted on or before July 15.

Fall 2023 application

Starting with the fall 2023 application cycle, UC will extend the application submission period. You will be able to submit your UC application between October 1 - November 30.

The application deadline will not change.

- Check TAP and your email regularly for admissions updates
- Follow all deadlines and submit documents on time (ie: transcripts, test scores)
